Read the below as guidelines for how an increasingly diverse district might better serve students and families of different backgrounds.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

Build partnerships at scale with the changing community

- Provide required professional learning to norm on mindsets about families, communities, and the role partnership plays in realizing student success.
- Provide clearer information and capacity-building aligned to engagement opportunities so that new and diverse populations can participate.

Engage long-lasting community partnerships that already impact students

- Leverage position as convener to bridge connections and coordinate resources across community groups in the region toward shared goals.

Amplify partnership between the school district and community leaders

- Invest in systems to identify and collect feedback from community partners at-scale.
- Add district-level capacity to cultivate and manage intentionally diverse partnerships that are asset-based, rooted in trust, and clearly aligned to district priorities

Provide stakeholders with more transparency and opportunities to provide feedback

- Develop a comprehensive communication strategy emphasizing more proactive, consistent communication with stakeholders around district priorities, news, and events
- Host accessible community events that focus on proactive updates, sharing feedback, and meaningful interaction with district leaders

Cultivate consistent experiences around family engagement with schools

- Establish system-wide expectations and tools for schools to connect families more directly to student learning, starting with leveraging family engagement bright spots
- Audit and map the existing ways students and caregivers can get involved to influence decision-making at the school and district levels

Improve information provided to caregivers at the school-level

- Conduct a communications audit to understand how various tools are being used and where there are opportunities to make communication more streamlined, consistent, and equitable.
